# HISTORY

## THE MAYOMAN WHO HALTED OPERATION OVERLORD (From an article in the Irish Times Monday June 6, 1994)

When Ted Sweeney filed his hourly weather reports to London from Blacksod Point Co Mayo, on June 4<sup>th</sup> 1944, he was blissfully unaware of the dramatic role he was playing in world history.

Within hours Operation Overlord the biggest combined land, sea and air operation of all time, was sensationally halted for 24 hours. The D-Day Normandy landings, scheduled for June 5<sup>th</sup> were delayed until the following day. Ted Sweeney, a native of Mayo, now in his 80's recalls with great clarity the events of June 4<sup>th</sup> 1944. He was on duty as usual while his wife Maureen was running the Post Office and also helping with some of the weather reports. They were in the old coastguard station in Blacksod, strategically located at the edge of Europe where the first indications of changing weather patterns could be gauged and relayed to the central co-ordinating offices. "I was sending an hourly report for the 24 hours day and night. It had to be phoned in to London. We got a query back. They asked for a check "Please check and repeat the whole report" I went to the office and checked the report and repeated it again. "I just wondered what was wrong. I thought I had made some error or something like that. "They sent a second message to me about an hour after to please check and repeat again I thought this was a bit strange so I checked and repeated again".

The weather report indicated that a cold front had crossed the north-west coast of Ireland. Forecasters in London, who were in close contact with the military planning operations, sounded a warning that this front would be over the English Channel at the planned time of the Normandy invasion on June 5<sup>th</sup>.

Intense coded communications were set in place as Operation Overlord was put "on hold" for 24 hours. Heavy rain and force 7 winds affected the English Channel on June 5<sup>th</sup> and could have proved disastrous for the entire operation. But a "break" came in the weather on June 6<sup>th</sup>, as indicated by the Blacksod report, and the conditions were far more suitable for "Overlord" to proceed.

But on that day, at a point in remote Mayo that juts out beyond Belmullet and whose neighboring parish to the west is somewhere in North America, life was little different from any other time. The talk was of fishing and farming and the War.

Ted Sweeney only found out about the significance of his weather reports and the reason for the phone calls from London at a much later date. " Months afterwards, perhaps even a few years, I was told by one of the Met office crowd that the reason they took heed of that particular report for Blacksod Point was the I was the first indication they got of a major change in the weather. " It never dawned on me that this was the weather for invading or anything like that. When I checked the report, I said "Thanks be to God I was not at fault anyway". I had done my job and sent over a correct reading to London.
